- **9%:** In 2012, President Obama limited U.S. military capability to fighting one "regional conflict" and one "holding action." Defense budgets for 2013-2021 were cut **\$487 billion a 9% cut, at a minimum**.
- **18%:** "Sequestration," required by law in 2011, mandates \$500 billion more in 2013-2021 defense cuts an **18% cut, at a minimum**. President Obama said he will veto any changes Congress makes.
- <u>Be Prepared:</u> In 2013 these cuts in defense jobs and businesses will hit New Hampshire counties, cities and industries. This report shows how "National Average" defense budget reductions of at least 9% and 18% could affect New Hampshire, using actual 2010 New Hampshire data.
- **Ask Questions:** In 2012, Congress and President Obama will decide on the specific defense budget cuts. In the next 6 months, find out if these defense cuts affect your community more or less than this national average. A 2011 nationwide economic impact study from the Center for Regional Analysis predicts that New Hampshire could lose thousands of jobs and hundreds of millions of dollars under the "Sequestration" law:

- New Hampshire could lose 3,321 jobs.
- New Hampshire's economy could lose \$196 million in lost earnings.
- New Hampshire could see a \$285 million decrease in Gross State Product (GSP).

Congressional experts estimate New Hampshire could lose DOD military active-duty and DOD civilian jobs:

- Under "Sequestration," 113 military active-duty employees could lose their jobs.
- Under "Sequestration," 262 civilian DOD employees could lose their jobs.

New Hampshire businesses will not escape the 9% and 18% cuts.

Public data for 2010 shows New Hampshire businesses earned over \$1.09 billion supporting America's defense:

- But under these 10-year defense cuts of at least 9%, New Hampshire **annual business losses** could be greater than **\$98 million**. New Hampshire businesses may have to **fire workers**.
- And at the "Sequestration" level of at least 18% in defense cuts, New Hampshire annual business losses could be greater than \$196 million. Some New Hampshire businesses may have to shut down.

With at least 9% or 18% in planned budget cuts, New Hampshire's small businesses will suffer.

From 2000-2010, **{TotalBusinesses} New Hampshire businesses** provided goods and services for America's national defense:

- **16 minority-owned businesses**, including 3 owned by Black Americans, 4 owned by Hispanic Americans, 2 owned by Native Americans, 4 owned by Asian-Pacific Americans, and 3 owned by other minority Americans.
- 21 small businesses including 18 "8A" and small disadvantaged businesses (SDB's)
- **55 woman-owned** businesses
- 61 veteran-owned businesses, including 16 owned by service-disabled veterans
